MAINTENANCE WARDEN – Unfortunately at our AGM Dec. 3rd, no one was nominated nor came forward to fill the Maintenance warden position. It is essential, by Quebec law, that we have six wardens. Please, seriously consider the possibility of volunteering for this by contacting the parish office or any one of the wardens.

Other Sign-Up sheets — At the AGM it was announced that we also need help in three areas: planning for an identifying sign in front of the church, planning for an accessibility lift or ramp to the hall, and responsibility for the monthly 'Meet & Greet'. The duties are:

Front Sign: determine exactly what we want: the look, the size, the location, the labour requirements, the costs, etc.

Accessibility: We may have the opportunity to get funding from Novatio, the City, the QC government, to make our hall accessible to the handicapped. Here again, we need a well-defined plan with what we want, where we want it, quotes on costs, fundraising plans and who we partner with, time frames, estimate of who will benefit, etc.

Meet & Greet: get persons to donate snacks; make beverages, set up in the back of the church, clean up afterwards. If four persons volunteer, each would be assigned three months per year.
