*****COVID RESTRICTIONS****

Provincial directives now require that Vaccination Passports and picture ID be validated to attend mass. Please consider arriving a little earlier before mass in order to validate your vaccination passport and ID. A list of validated passports will be maintained to reduce revalidation from week to week.

St. Aloysius mass capacity is now set at **72** in the church.

Procedural tri-fold masks remain mandatory (FABRIC or CLOTH MASKS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE) as per diocesan directives. Procedural masks must now be worn AT ALL TIMES, even while seated in the church. The exceptions are ministers can remove their face coverings when intervening in the liturgy and choir members can remove their masks to sing if they can keep a distance of 2 m between themselves.

Social distancing of 1-meter between individuals must be maintained. Upon arrival and during mass, attendees are not to move about in the church but must remain in their pews. During communion, those wishing to receive the eucharist are to stand in their pew and wait for a eucharistic minister or the pastor to bring the eucharist to them.

Wednesday and Friday morning masses will follow the same protocols as Sunday mass.
