Update from the St. Aloysius Finance Warden – 2023 Budget

As we head into the final few months of the year, I wanted to provide you with an update on our current financial situation. As is typically the case after the quiet months of summer, we find ourselves in a deficit situation from a budget perspective. Additionally, this summer we have had to make some significant renovations imposed following a fire inspection report from the city in early spring. Of note are the replacement of 2 exit doors on the east and west sides of the church. Separately, some work in the office has been required because of water damage in the spring. These unexpected costs, in addition to our typical slow summer months have created a current deficit of \$8000 that we need to address before the end of the fiscal year on December 31st. I recognize that we are all facing rising costs in our personal finances due to inflation and our means of financial support to the church are being stressed. However, I am confident and thankful that you will all respond to this additional need through your weekly contributions as you have consistently done in the past. On behalf of the Wardens Board, I thank you for your continued support of our wonderful and blessed community.
