THE ARCHDIOCESE IS CHANGING ITS ONLINE DONATION PLATFORM (January 1st)

For several years, the Archdiocese of Gatineau has offered a secure online donation platform on its website. As of January 1, 2021, a new platform will come into operation to replace the one currently in service. More user-friendly, the new platform will continue to make it possible to make a secure one-off or recurring donations to the diocese and to the 53 parishes of our Diocesan Church. As of January 2021, people who currently make online donations will have to register in the new platform and enter their contact details and the terms of their donation to their parish or the diocese. Existing contact details and monthly recurring donations will not be transferred automatically into the new system. Parishioners who have setup recurring monthly donations will receive an e-mail from the diocese in the coming weeks with further details. The new donation platform will be accessible on the diocese's website under the menu item *Donate now*. Hail, Full of Grace!

Today's readings focus on the circumstances leading up to the first coming of Jesus, the event which sets the pattern for his coming to us now and at the end of time. The Gospel stresses the key role of Mary in the work of our salvation. In addition, today's Scripture texts describe God's promise to David and its fulfillment in Jesus, the Son of David. They also tell us that God's preparation for the coming of Jesus was full of surprises. The unfolding of God's plan of salvation through history has contained many surprises. The first reading surprises us by telling of God's promise to David that he would have a long line of royal descendants culminating in a final King, Jesus Christ. In the Responsorial Psalm (Ps 89), the Psalmist recalls all of God's promises and surprises describing God's promise to David and his descendants in terms of a Covenant. The second reading surprises us as well with Paul's explanation of the unveiling of God's plan for human salvation through Jesus.

Today's Gospel surprises us by telling us that this final King would be born to an ordinary virgin, not by means of sexual relationship, but through the Holy Spirit, and that this Son of God, Jesus, would become a descendant of David. This would occur through Joseph, Mary's betrothed husband and the legal father of her son, as Joseph was "of the House of David." The Gospel narrative also surprises us by reminding us that God's promise is best fulfilled not in buildings, or even in great kings like Solomon, but rather in humble souls like Mary who trusted in God's promise. Mary is the centre of God's special choice that entails innumerable blessings. This however asked of her a lot of sacrifices. The divine proposition that she would be the mother of the Son of God is very attractive but also fraught with contradictions. She cannot understand how she, as a virgin, could bear a child. She would no doubt have to face the fury of an orthodox Jewish society. What confusion for her!

With the angel's intervention Mary is assured of the power of the Holy Spirit in her life. She declares her 'fiat' and surrenders herself and her whole life to divine purpose, not as prisoner however, but freely, as a woman of faith. Sometimes the sacrifices our state of life may require of us may seem overwhelming to us; but we need not feel disheartened. Faith is the ingredient for us as it was for Mary. If we have faith, there is nothing that God cannot do for us. In this Gospel we see fulfilled the predictions made about Jesus. In the first place, Mary was to give to the child a name 'Jesus', a name given even before His conception. The Gospel says 'great will be his dignity': today we offer no higher dignity to anyone than we do to Jesus. Jesus would be called 'the Son of the Most High God': that which Christians have always believed. He will be given 'the throne of His father, David': Jesus embodies all the royalty of David and much more. The Gospel also says 'His reign will be without end': while David's reign lasted for forty years, Jesus reigns forever. This is what Christmas is all about. We celebrate the birth of One who is no ordinary child. We celebrate *Immanuel*, God is with us.

POSTPONEMENT OF THE 2020 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (AGM)

Normally in early December St-Al's holds its' Annual General Meeting for the election of churchwardens and to provide reports of each of the portfolios. However, we have been directed by the diocese to postpone the AGM as long as Gatineau is deemed a red zone.

If the situation improves before March 1, 2021 an announcement will be made at least six days in advance of the proposed AGM date. Note that the current churchwardens will remain in office until the election is held. Should we remain a red zone beyond March 1st, following the

recommendation of the parish priest and the chairperson, the bishop will appoint new churchwardens to replace the outgoing churchwardens.
