2023 FINANCIAL RESULTS FOR ST. ALOYSIUS – Finance Warden

Now that 2023 is behind us, I wanted to provide an update on how we did financially. Although we have seen a significant increase in our congregation over the past year with many new wonderful parishioners, the economic realities of inflation and unexpected expenses (eg fire doors) have had an impact on our budget. With a large deficit of close to \$12,000 projected in late November and reported at the annual AGM, the parish once again this year generously provided support over the month of December to cover the monthly expenses and most of the projected deficit. As a result, at year-end (December 31st), the parish was left with a deficit of only \$1059 which will be easily covered by funds in our bank account. Although multiple deficits from year to year are not a good thing and must be addressed, the 2023 deficit is the first deficit the parish has incurred in many years. Given the current economic times, it is important for the parish to properly manage its budget and we will need to remain vigilant to budget pressures over the coming years. Copies of the 2023 year-end report have been posted on the bulletin board at the entrances of the church for perusal. Please contact me should you have any questions.

As my term as Finance Warden is now done, I wanted to thank all parishioners for their personal, spiritual and financial support over these past six years. Jo Anne Lambert has assumed the role of the Finance Warden as of January 1st and comes with a pedigree of financial wardenship as well as many years of involvement within the parish. She will be an excellent Finance Warden. I will assist her in her transition to the role and will remain involved at the committee level. Thank you.



Looking Back Paperback - Oct. 26 2023

This book describes the education of Dez Kamara in faith, hope, and hard work. Starting from his early schooling and the educational values of his stern but loving father, Dez's educational journey takes him from boarding school to the disruptions of the civil war in Sierra Leone to his move to pursue his education in Canada. As a young man, he first experienced the violence of war before working to help even younger people affected by it. His work with child soldiers leads not only to a meeting with Romeo Dallaire but the making of a film about their experiences. It is his curiosity about the world and his resilience that carry him through. While the thread of education weaves through this heartfelt memoir, generosity and courage are its biggest gifts. While Dez benefits from the generosity of others throughout his experiences, he returns that generosity in full measure in this book.
