Evalina and Eric Filion were married a year and a half ago and are both professional Catholic missionaries with Catholic Christian Outreach, a Canadian university ministry. Eric is a native of Ottawa where he studied Engineering, Philosophy, and Theology at university. He has lived and worked as a missionary coast to coast: Vancouver, Saskatoon, Kingston, St John's, and Ottawa. He currently serves as a manager in CCO's HR department. Evalina was born and raised in Calgary before studying Biology and Concurrent Education at Queen's University in Kingston. After several years as a missionary on campus, Evalina has taken on a role in CCO's Formation department

before going on maternity leave to care for their first child, Eden. Eric and Evalina fell in love through their common passion for canoeing and adventure... but they believe that the greatest adventure is following Jesus.

MAINTENANCE WARDEN – Unfortunately at our AGM Dec. 3rd, no one was nominated nor came forward to fill the Maintenance warden position. It is essential, by Quebec law, that we have six wardens. 2023 FINANCIAL RESULTS FOR ST. ALOYSIUS – Finance Warden

Now that 2023 is behind us, I wanted to provide an update on how we did financially. Although we have seen a significant increase in our congregation over the past year with many new wonderful parishioners, the economic realities of inflation and

unexpected expenses (eg fire doors) have had an impact on our budget. With a large deficit of close to \$12,000 projected in late November and reported at the annual AGM, the parish once again this year generously provided support over the month of December to cover the monthly expenses and most of the projected deficit. As a result, at year-end (December 31st), the parish was left with a deficit of only \$1059 which will be easily covered by funds in our bank account. Although multiple deficits from year to year are not a good thing and must be addressed, the 2023 deficit is the first deficit the parish has incurred in many years. Given the current economic times, it is important for the parish to properly manage its budget and we will need to remain vigilant to budget pressures over the coming years. Copies of the 2023 year-end report have been posted on the bulletin board at the entrances of the church for perusal. Please contact me should you have any questions.

As my term as Finance Warden is now done, I wanted to thank all parishioners for their personal, spiritual and financial support over these past six years. Jo Anne Lambert has assumed the role of the Finance Warden as of January 1st and comes with a pedigree of financial wardenship as well as many years of involvement within the parish. She will be an excellent Finance Warden. I will assist her in her transition to the role and will remain involved at the committee level. Thank you.
