***Reflections from an Indigenous Catholic on Evangelization*** - Hon. Graydon Nicholas

As we support our Church's efforts towards truth and reconciliation with Canada's Indigenous peoples, you are most welcome to join Concerned Lay Catholics at their upcoming Spring Keynote which will feature a presentation by Graydon Nicholas, CM, O.N.B, LL.D. Graydon Nicholas, a member of the Order of Canada, served as the appointed 30th Lieutenant Governor of New Brunswick (2009-2014). He is the first Indigenous person to hold the office, the first to be appointed as a provincial court judge (in 1991), and the first in Atlantic Canada to obtain a law degree. Graydon is also a devout Catholic, a member of the Our Lady of Guadalupe Circle and a founder of the Indigenous Catholic Research Fellowship. *Reflections from an Indigenous Catholic on Evangelization* will take place on Saturday May 28 from 2-4 p.m. As we approach one year since the disclosure of the unmarked graves at Kamloops, we encourage everyone to listen, participate and learn.
